# TENANT FOCUS

#### WHY ASK PEOPLE TO SMOKE OUTDOORS?

In 2011 all SHRA buildings are becoming smoke-free indoors because secondhand smoke badly affects the health of adults and children. Second hand smoke is the drifting smoke from cigarettes. It is breathed in by non-smokers because it seeps under doors, drifts through hallways, flows through air ducts, and even leaches through walls.

Second hand smoke (SHS) contains 4,000 chemicals, 50 of these are proven to cause cancer. There is no safe level of exposure to second hand smoke.

Cigarette smoke is absorbed into walls, floors, furniture, toys, clothes, and other household surfaces. People spend most of their time at home, which is an enclosed

space where they are exposed to their neighbors' second hand smoke for long periods of time.

A 2010 study showed that **84.5%** of children who live in apartments where nobody smokes in their own household still breathe in second hand smoke that drifts from neighbors' units.

Second Hand Smoke has something to hurt everyone:

- In children it causes asthma attacks, ear infections, and breathing problems
- In adults it contributes to hearing loss and heart disease
- Second hand smoke has also been proven to seriously increase the risk of breast cancer in young women

## Here's what SHRA tenants say about second hand smoke:

- 54% had been bothered by secondhand smoke drifting into their apartments
- 75% said they would prefer to live in a smokefree building
- 82% believe that secondhand smoke is a serious health hazard







nonsmokers from exposure to secondhand smoke. Separating smokers from nonsmokers, cleaning the air, and ventilating buildings cannot eliminate exposure of nonsmokers to secondhand smoke. The United States Fire Administration indicates smoking as the number one cause of home fire deaths in the United States." HUD, Sept. 15, 2010

Smoking outdoors can be a WIN for everyone families, neighbors, even pets!


You might be surprised to know some of the deadly chemicals found in cigarette smoke. They include:

- Cadmium used to make batteries
- Formaldehyde embalming fluid
- Arsenic poison that builds

up in people's bodies over time

- Toluene used to make paint, paint thinners, and nail polish.
- Not to mention Nicotine which is used in insecticides as well as cigarettes.

Remember, smokefree policies are about the smoke, not the smoker. Smoke-free policies do not keep someone who smokes from living in the building; they just ensure that tenants and their
