SacRT's New Bus Network: Resources Available for Riders



Sack I's new bus network launches Sunday, September 8, 2019! Almost every bus route has been adjusted to improve frequency, scheduling, and weekend service. SacRT has many great resources available to help riders navigate the route changes.

As part of SacRT Forward, new bus stop signs will be at bus stops throughout SacRT's service area. The new signs not only feature a new look, but also include the bus

The Housing Authority of the City and County of Sacramento plan to apply for disposition of the Scattered Sites (4 units or less) and Tenant Protection Vouchers (TPVs). The disposition removes the Annual Contributions Contract (ACC) from the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to convert the units to a more stable Project Based Section 8 platform. TPVs

are meant to ensure there is no displacement of low-income residents as a result of various actions resulting in a loss of subsidy assistance. This action will not displace residents from any public housing development or unit. The units will continue to be managed by the Housing Authority of the City and County of Sacramento. If a unit requires rehabilitation then a resident will be temporarily relocated while the unit is being rehabbed. They will have the right

to return to their unit when the

rehab is complete.

Admissions and Continued Occupancy Policy (ACOP)

Each year the Housing Authority of the City and County of Sacramento must submit an update to their **Annual Plan** to HUD for final approval. The Sacramento Resident Advisory Board plays an integral part in this process. In April we go to the resident meetings an get resident input on the **Capitol Fund** portion of the plan. In July and August we review changes to the **ACOP** with SHRA. The completed package goes to the Commission on the 4th of September for a public hearing, then if approved, it is forwarded to HUD for adoption. The documents are published on SHRAs website for public review and comment. The public comment period closes after this item is heard by the commission.
