SHRA LOOKS AT SACRAMENTO SMOKING ORDINANCES

Sacramento is taking fight against smoking to the approximately 42,000 multifamily rental units in the The Council approved resolution encouraging property owners to designate at least 25% of their rental units for nonsmokers. Property owners and developers voluntarily setting aside 25% of their units for nonsmokers publicly be will recognized by the council. "Secondhand smoke is a toxic air contaminant that penetrates the walls of apartments Councilman

Kevin McCarty said in urging the council to adopt the measure he introduced.

In accordance with a Resolution passed by the County Sacramento on April 10, 2007, multi-unit housing with minimum of 50% of existing units designated as nonsmoking, including private patios balconies, will receive a certificate and public recognition.

SHRA will be setting their policy soon with input from the RAB.

southern California to play their games you will definitely want to vote for these. If you do not gamble or only play locally your vote should be based on revenues


