In September we attended the 2017 National Resident Services and Resident Leaders' Conference hosted by National Alliance of Resident Services in Affordable and Assisted Housing (NAR-SAAH) in Baltimore, Maryland. We were acquainted with Dr. Samuel Little, NAR-SAAH leaders and partners and several Resident

Councils across the nation. It was inspiring to hear from the councils what they have done and are doing to make their communities safe, beautiful, educated and alive. One inspirational story was that of a resident who offered to open her home for a porch book club for younger female residents. It grew from 1 to 15 women. Soon the young men of the community were asking her to do the same for them. She is changing the lives of the next generation.

Resource Fair

In November we assisted the other three ROSS programs in organizing a Resource Fair with over 37 organizations and agencies from health, financial institution, mortgage companies, education and higher education, family services, employment services, training services, CHP and others. We look forward to bring the resource fair back in 2018.



Family Self– Sufficiency Program FSS

The Family Self Sufficiency program is voluntary. As a participant of the FSS program you will sign an FSS Contract of Participation and will develop an Individual Training and Service Plan with the FSS Coordinator. The COP is a five year contract that outlines your rights and responsibilities while on the FSS program. The

ITSP is a plan that outlines the goals you choose to work towards while participating in the FSS program such as attending school, securing employment, improving your credit, purchasing a home, or whatever goals you have set forth for yourself. A key element in the program is the participant's opportunity to

establish an escrow account enabling the family to accumulate money which can lead to economic self-sufficiency.

SHRA's Jobs Plus collaborated with 13 agencies to bring services

directly to you. Computers are available to assist with job searches and resume writing. You can also obtain your high school diploma at the Marina Vista Site, 30 Seavey Circle, and receive skills that prepare you for work. There are three partner agencies on site: Department of Human Assistance, Sacramento Employment and Training Agency and Asian Resources Inc. We offer a wide variety of workshops that assist in the job seeking process. The workshops are designed to develop and build an arsenal of skills to keep you competitive in today's job market. Jobs Plus also includes technical training and internships.

Participants who are active in the program may be eligible for an earned income disallowance.

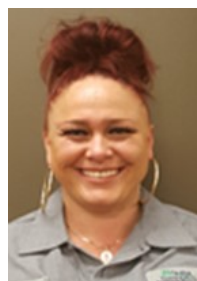
