### What is a Fair Housing Study?



The Civil Rights Act requires that states, Neighborhoods with counties, and cities

receiving federal housing and community development funds assist HUD in "Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing" Choice." The required starting point is conducting a study to analyze fair housing barriers. This is called the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing or AI. The overall goal of the study is to help communities improve economic conditions and housing options for all residents, in a way that best fits the community. Who is doing the regional AI? The AI is a partnership among local jurisdictions and housing authorities: Housing Authorities of the City and County of Sacramento, Yolo, Roseville and Rocklin; tailored and ensure diversity in County of Sacramento; cities of Sacramento, Folsom, Isleton, Galt, Elk Grove, Citrus Heights, Rancho Cordova, West Sacramento, Davis, Woodland, Roseville, and Rocklin.

How will the study benefit residents in the region?

Research has shown that where housing is located makes a difference in people's

access to good schools, jobs, recreation, healthy

lives.

reduce public service costs. The fair housing study helps identify where jurisdictions should focus their efforts to ensure that residents have equal access to quality communities-while also preserving the unique identities of local neighborhoods and schools.
